

Guided tours of Murals of La Jolla

Scheduled on the last Wednesday of every month, walking tours leave from the Athenaeum at 5:30 p.m. Tours are free and registration is required. Visit l Athenaeum.org/murals to register.

The Athenaeum Music & Arts Library, administrator of Murals of La Jolla, is pleased to host walking tours of the murals. Join fellow art enthusiasts and learn more about the artists and their artworks during a guided walking tour led by Murals of La Jolla Executive Director Lynda Forsha.

Fifteen murals are currently on view, and each tour features more than half of these. The route changes each time to accommodate new murals. It is a gentle walk around the village, but we ask participants to please wear comfortable shoes. Participants in the tour are responsible for their own safety.

Murals of La Jolla, founded by the La Jolla Community Foundation, is a project of the Athenaeum. The program demonstrates that commissioning artists to create works for public spaces brings energy and vitality to a community. Over the past eleven years, large-scale artworks have appeared in a variety of locations throughout the village of La Jolla, some prominently displayed while others are tucked away in more discreet locations.
